In 2017, I reconfigured Rutgers-Camden's Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Criminal Justice course "Individual and Society" and made it "Writing Intensive." This was a course required for the department's majors. Converting it into a writing intensive course allowed it to fulfill the college's general education writing requirement.

In 2014, I won a Rutgers-Camden Digital Teaching Fellowship to learn to incorporate tactics to create a "flipped classroom" with more technology into the classroom. As a result, I incorporated the use of the application Padlet to allow students to write their responses to discussion questions in a public forum. This has enabled participation for students who are less comfortable with public speaking. I also regularly attended on-campus "Teaching Matters" at Rutgers-Camden workshops to learn new ways of setting, clarifying, and helping students meet learning outcomes. These workshops also helped me to incorporate more writing into all of my courses. The upward trend over time in my student ratings suggests that these efforts are paying off.
